

Ministering

We had a second Prayer and Healing service on the first Sunday evening of the month. I want to try to describe what this service is like, especially for those of you who haven't attended one.

It is a worship service, so that means we sing and there is a short teaching time from scripture on the topic of healing. But the main focus of the service is an unhurried time of prayer. We invite people to come forward for the laying on of hands and prayer. People will speak their need and then together we ask God to answer our prayer. I can't put into words the tenderness with which we pray together and the sense of unity that prayer brings.

Some of this happens, as I said, when people come forward so that the pastors can pray for them. But much of the prayer, perhaps the most powerful portion, happens in the pews. At our first prayer service in November, I remember after praying with multiple people, I looked out across the pews and saw people huddled together in twos and threes. And they were praying for each other. It was a beautiful sight. This wasn't programmed. No one told them to do this. Maybe the Spirit told them. It was the people of God *ministering* to each other.

We often use the word "minister" only to mean pastor. But in the New Testament the whole Church had the responsibility of ministry. All were ministers. Did not Jesus ask Peter and James and John to stay awake and pray with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane, so that they would be ready for what was to come?

Our Sunday morning services have a particular order and structure to them. And that is good. But there are things maybe that God will only do in us if do not hurry, if we are prepared to take our time in prayer and worship. That is the value of our Prayer and Healing Service. I hope you will come to the next one. It is on Sunday, May 4 at 6pm. **Continued page 2**

God doesn't stop...

There have been a lot of good things happening recently with the Youth Ministry here at Hicks. I am going to report on some of them however every once in a while I find that I need to share some of my own personal reflections with the larger church body. It has been no secret to anyone that helps in a ministry field that there are periods of mountain top highs when we feel that things are just going well and we can see things very clearly. There are other times when it feels like we are walking through the desert and have no clue which way to turn or when things will start to change for the better.

For probably most of the past two years I have felt more in the desert with youth ministry and less on top of the mountain; trying to figure out the best ways to help these kids. It is no secret to the church that Covid changed things but, personally I feel youth ministry just flat out changed after Covid. While I had been trying to figure out Gen Z and ways to reach them God has already been working in the hearts and minds of this generation and I am finally starting to see what God has been doing.

I was listening to a podcast the other week (I would cite it but I can't remember what it was called) that was discussing the characteristics of young people ages 12-25 and they said that this generation in particular has been the most receptive to hearing the Gospel of Jesus Christ since the 1950's. A common pattern that gets displayed between generations is that the new upcoming generation always rebels against ideas of previous generations. Basically the sex, drugs, and rock n roll culture that we grew up in isn't "cool" anymore. Stability is the new cool (weird) and many many young people are not just receptive to the idea of the gospel but are pursuing it as a map for their lives. It is our job as the church to help them read that map and just provide guidance as they start their journey's.

We have 6 youth in our church currently on a journey to becoming members in our church through the confirmation process. These teens have been meeting two times a month with Pastor Allyce and myself, required to volunteer for 10 hours within a few different ministries within the church and are required to meet with a mentor on a regular basis. This group really has confirmed for me the information I shared above by the questions that they have asked and their willingness to gain knowledge throughout this process. It is huge for Hicks when anyone comes to Christ. It is a huge deal when 6 young people will confess that Jesus is their lord and savior in front of the whole church body. The message of Jesus Christ is a message that has transcended throughout every generation for the past 2,000 years. It is no different with this current generation as well. The confirmands will join the church April 13 at both 9:45 and 11:15 service please consider joining us in the celebration of the Holy Spirit moving in the lives of these young people.
