

Seedbed

I remember watching a documentary about a man who spent decades of his life living in a remote wilderness cabin where there were no roads. Every few months a bush pilot would drop off some supplies to him. Needless to say, the man was remarkably self-sufficient. Since he was in the wilderness of the north, winters were particularly harsh and solitary. It was interesting to me how the man used even the "downtimes" of winter to be productive and live each day fully. When there were several feet of snow on the ground and he couldn't really do much outside, he would work inside his cabin, making improvements, crafting small utensils and pieces of furniture, cleaning his gun and gear, cooking meals, making plans.

You don't have to live in the remote wilderness to do valuable work in winter. All those commercial greenhouses that we visit in Spring and early Summer are even now making their plans, ordering seeds. In not so many weeks, while there is perhaps still snow on the ground, they will begin planting their seeds and nursing that growth so that it is ready for the Spring.

In both these examples, people do what work they can while the ground is frosty and hard. They work ahead to be ready when conditions will be ripe for growth. They don't just ask, "What's on tv?"

If they did that, if they waited until everything was nice and warm outside, they wouldn't be ready for the best growth.

Friends, now is the time for us to plant the seeds of new spiritual growth in our persons. Plan for it now. Do the work you can do now. I was reminded recently that the word *seminary* is a Latin word meaning "seed bed." In a sense, every follower of Jesus goes to seminary. We intentionally plant the seeds of the kingdom in our persons and lives. What do these seeds look like?

They are the seeds of quiet prayers on a cold morning or dark bedtime. They are seeds of a scripture verse we read that we carry with us through the day. They are the seeds of a community group that we attend. They are seeds of serving and giving in our church and larger community. Now is the time to do this work. Who knows what God might grow in you.

"The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and planted in his field. It is the smallest of seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and makes nests in its branches."





Ideas for Integrating Faith into Family Life

Set Aside Time for Family Devotions and Prayer: Create a regular schedule for family devotions and prayer. This could be during a meal, before bedtime or any set time that works for your family.

Apply Biblical Lessons to Daily Challenges: Use biblical principles to address daily challenges and conflicts. Applying biblical lessons helps children understand the relevance of faith in everyday situations.

Create a Prayer Wall and set Prayer Time: Dedicate a space in your home where family members can post prayer requests, thanksgiving notes, or spiritual goals. Seeing this faith-inaction encourages families to take time to pray, and it fosters a sense of community and care. It's a place for reflection and a reminder of the power of prayer in your family's life.

Lead by Serving and Serve Together: Choose a community or church service project to do as a family. This shows faith in action while teaching children the importance of empathy and caring for others. Great options include:

Enjoy Faith Music and Art: Faith- filled music and art inspires and uplifts! Play Christian music as you drive, work, or play. Have a Christian Dance Party in the kitchen. Watch God-honoring shows on TV and at the theaters.
